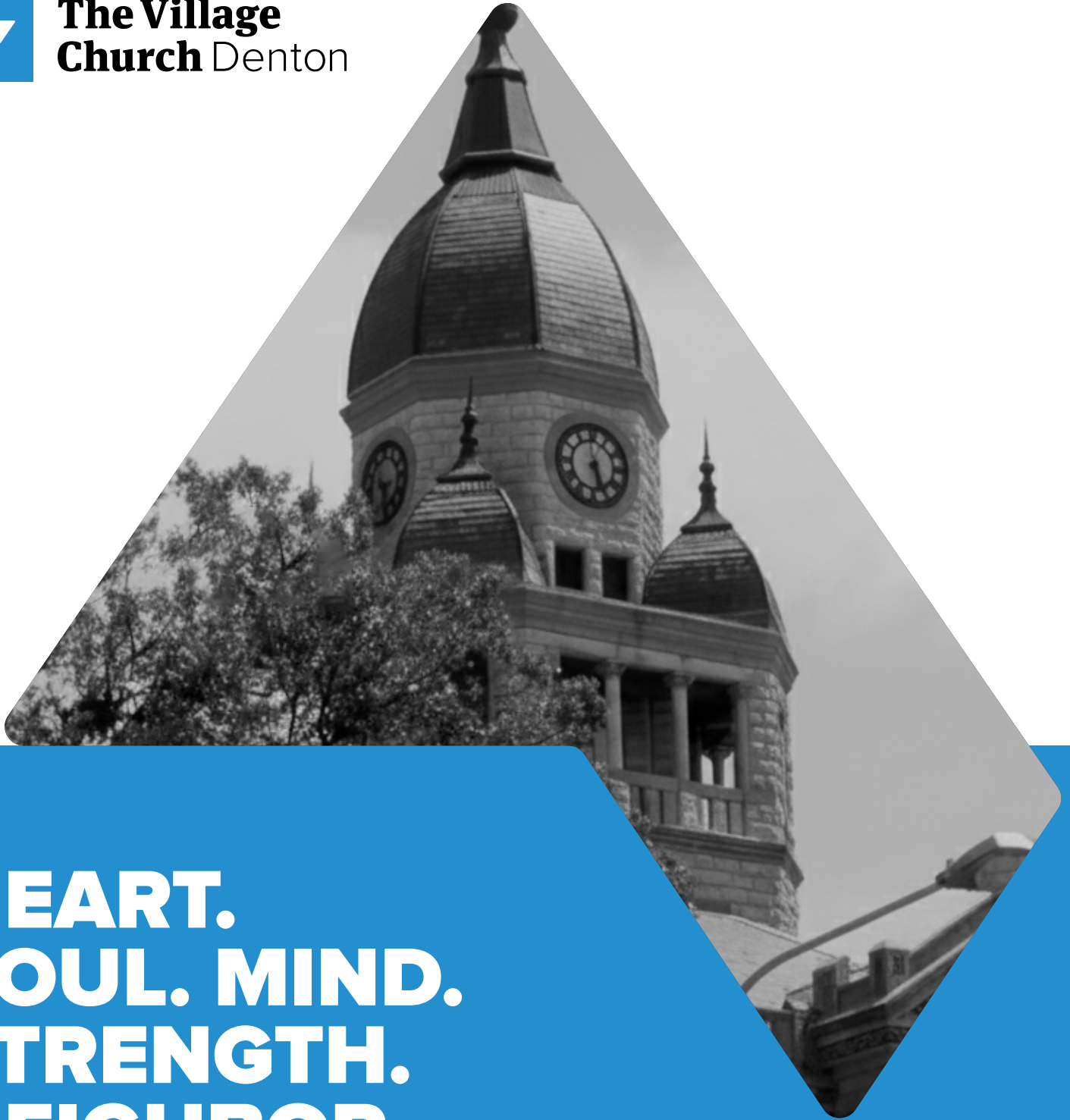

THE POSITION

The Lead Pastor of The Village Church Denton (TVCD) will serve as the primary spiritual leader and theological shepherd of the church. TVCD is a gospel-centered, elder-led, multi-generational, multi-ethnic congregation rooted in the heart of Denton, Texas. We are not in a season of planting or revitalization, but seeking one of long-term stability, spiritual maturity, and intentional shepherding. We are seeking a humble and wise leader of people—especially ministerial staff—who brings a calm presence, relational depth, and theological clarity. Public visibility or platform-building is not encouraged; rather, we desire a leader whose presence is most powerfully felt within the congregation.

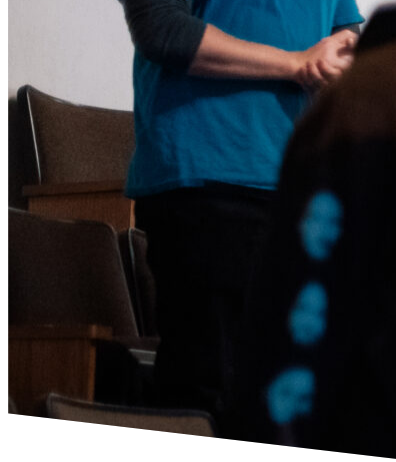
The Lead Pastor will serve as the leader of leaders at TVCD—providing clarity, direction, and encouragement to the Lead Team and full staff. This role requires high emotional intelligence and energy to lead the Lead Team, shepherd staff culture, and support elder development.

We are a teaching team without a single dominant preacher, and the Lead Pastor will champion this collaborative model—encouraging and equipping other staff and elder voices to regularly share in the preaching ministry.

In addition to theological vision and teaching, the Lead Pastor must be a gifted manager of people—a strategic and dependable leader who can organize, empower, and support a healthy team culture. They must be capable of supervising senior staff, aligning ministries, and making wise decisions that strengthen operations, shepherd people, and foster organizational health.

The ideal candidate will embody gospel-centered leadership, pastoral warmth, and a commitment to equipping others. They will lead with conviction and gentleness, honoring TVCD's rich history while discerning the Spirit's guidance for the future.

We are seeking a leader who will faithfully teach God's Word, equip the saints for ministry, and shepherd both staff and members with wisdom and grace. Rather than seeking a platform-builder, we desire a pastor whose presence is most deeply felt in the life of the body—encouraging and developing others, cultivating unity, and modeling dependence on the Spirit.





WHAT WE BELIEVE

The gospel is the good news of God's grace invading the darkness of this world. It is the grand narrative of creation, fall, redemption and consummation ordained by God and orchestrated through the life, death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus Christ. Christ's crucifixion is the heart of the gospel. His resurrection is the power of the gospel. His ascension is the glory of the gospel.

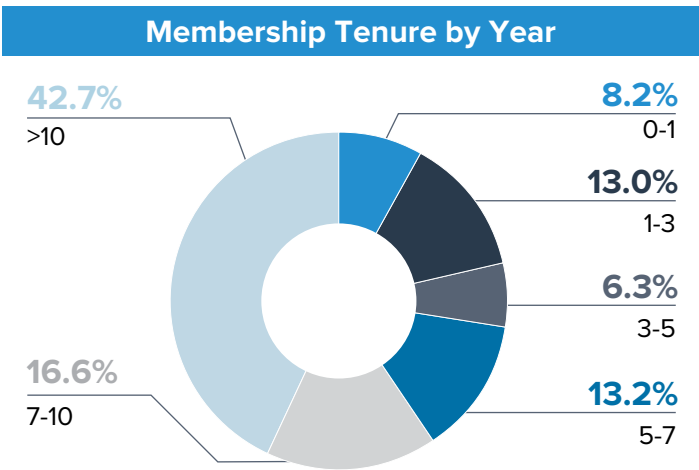
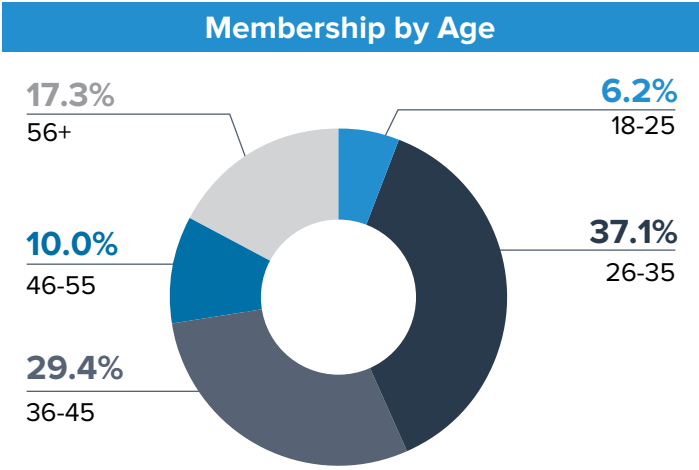

These practices are for the entire church community, from newcomers to long-time members, who seek to explore and engage in these transformative practices. Join us in following Jesus together by embracing these rhythms of abiding in God's love.



Abiding in the Story

As Christians, we live our lives in a different story. Instead of living in the stories of the world, we live in the story of God. We do this in multiple ways including the historical church calendar.

It's a beautiful story of redemption, hope, glory, joy, and love. As a community, we want to display this story to the world through the ways that we live with each other in service and love.



Abiding in Waiting

While Christians live in this world, we are waiting for a new heavens and new earth when King Jesus returns.

That doesn't mean we ignore this world. Instead, we love and serve this world as a living example while we patiently await the time when all will be made right.



Abiding in Prayer

God hears the prayers of his people. We seek to always be in communion with God through prayer.

We do this as a community by prayer together in our Sunday service, in our monthly Church-wide prayer service, and throughout the week in home groups.



Abiding in Liturgy

Liturgy means "the work of the people." Every Sunday, we gather together as the body of Christ and work out our salvation together.



We do this through worship, scripture reading, prayer and confession, generosity, passing the peace, the proclamation of the Word, and the Lord's Supper.

Abiding in Feasting

HOW WE LIVE TVCD

Biblical Aspirations

You see what we're pursuing through our covenant reflected in part in Acts 2:42-47.

Regular Gatherings

1. Main worship service

- a. Follows basic storyline of the gospel (God's goodness; our sin; God's mercy in Christ; our response).
- b. We sing the gospel (see article on music in membership matters booklet).
- c. We are led in prayer (praise, confession, petition, thanks).
- d. We hear God's word read.
- e. We hear God's word preached. And we celebrate baptisms.
 - Sermons are generally expository
 - Read the passage through the week.

2. Members' meetings

- a. 5 times each year on the 3rd Sunday of every other month.
- b. For members only.

- c. Discuss church business (reports from ministries, updates on finances, Affirming members in/out).
 - Voting of members
 - Ministry Updates
 - Leadership/Staffing Updates
 - Budget Updates

3. Church-Wide Prayer

- a. Meets at 5pm on 1st Sunday of the month.
- b. More of a family time: worship, sing, pray.
- c. Prayer time: a time to hear what's going on in our lives and lift these things to the Lord.

We expect all members to come to both Sunday morning and Sunday evening.

4. Group Life

- a. Throughout the week. At different times. Different areas of Denton.
- b. As part of our church's comprehensive strategy for making disciples, Home Groups provide a context for our church members to watch over one another in Christian love as we seek to cultivate faith in Christ Jesus and forge Christlike character.





5. Children

- a. Kids are always welcome at all of our services.
- b. In addition: special programs for them during services.
 - Preschool Ministry: Little Village - Sundays at 8:45 & 11
 - Elementary Ministry: Kids Village - Sundays at 8:45 & 11
 - Middle School - Wednesdays at 6 pm

- High School - Wednesday at 6 pm

6. Classes

- a. Women's Bible Study (Tuesday 7 pm)
- b. Men's Bible Study (Thursday 7 pm)
- c. MDWK - College Gathering (Wednesdays 9 pm)
- d. Family Equipping classes/forums

Intentional Relationships



How do you get involved? Invest in relationships.



We're a relationship-based church—not a program-driven church.

From what we've seen, the best way to cultivate long-term spiritual health is for you to invest in intentional, spiritual relationships.

- We want to cultivate a culture where it is normal for members to take initiative to build relationships with other members with the deliberate aim of doing them spiritual good.
- Entrepreneurial in nature: no special permission is needed to love in this way.
- Organic and messy: can't map this out on a spreadsheet.
- But we've found that over time, this results in community that is deeper, longer-lasting, and encompasses a wider cross-section of our church.



ROLE SUMMARY

The Lead Pastor will provide pastoral leadership to the staff, elders and deacons, and the congregation at The Village Church Denton by overseeing and maintaining the theological vision of TVCD through regular preaching and teaching, overseeing all church wide gatherings, leading out in the collaboration and care of the church's elders, deacons, & staff, and maintaining relationships and cooperation with TVCD's ministry partners.

Provide theological vision and direction in partnership with the Elder Board, guiding the church toward unity, health, and mission.



Staff Development

Shepherd and equip staff and lay leaders, cultivating a healthy team culture that is collaborative, encouraging, and gospel-driven.



Preaching & Teaching

Share in the regular preaching ministry with other pastors and elders, faithfully expounding Scripture with a gospel-centered lens.



Pastoral Presence

Be accessible and present among the congregation, modeling Christlike care, humility, and relational warmth.



Collaboration

Work closely with elders, deacons, and ministry leaders to ensure alignment across ministries and to encourage shared leadership.

The Lead Pastor is accountable to the elders of The Village Church Denton as well as the congregation of The Village Church Denton. The Lead Pastor oversees the following: Associate Pastor of Adult Ministries, Associate Minister of Operations, Associate Pastor of Family Ministries, Associate Minister of Connections and Care, and Campus Outreach Regional Director.



Ministry and Educational Preferences

- A seminary degree (MDiv or equivalent) is strongly preferred.
- Minimum of 5 years of pastoral ministry experience, including preaching, staff leadership, and shepherding.
- Demonstrated maturity, self-awareness, and a proven track record of faithful, long-term ministry.
- Committed to making TVCD their long-term church home, rooted in the Denton community.

- Demonstrates deep personal devotion to Christ and a life shaped by prayer, scripture, and obedience.
- Lives with integrity and exemplifies the qualifications of an elder as outlined in 1 Timothy 3 and Titus 1.

- Committed to ongoing spiritual growth, accountability, and the work of the Holy Spirit.
- Cultivates emotional and spiritual health, abiding in Christ, and reliance on God's grace.
- Upholds the The Village Church Denton's Membership Covenant
- Qualified to be an Elder at The Village Church Denton

Theological Alignment

- Holds to historic, orthodox Christian belief.
- Fully aligned with the theological vision and doctrinal commitments of The Village Church Denton and The Village Church Denton Statement of Faith
- Demonstrates the ability to faithfully apply theology to real-life pastoral, cultural, and ecclesial contexts.
- Values the diverse, multi-generational, gospel-centered, and locally embedded vision of TVCD.

Preaching & Teaching

- A clear, engaging, and faithful expositor of the Scriptures with a gospel-centered lens.

- Able to communicate complex biblical truth with clarity, conviction, and pastoral sensitivity.
- Committed to collaborative sermon planning and developing other teachers and preachers within the body.
- Demonstrates a shepherding posture from the pulpit—calling people to repentance, faith, obedience, and hope in Christ.

- Casts a compelling vision that invites the congregation into worship, formation, and mission.

Staff Leadership & Development

- Leads, equips, and cares for staff with relational maturity and clear direction.
- Cultivates a team culture marked by encouragement, trust, and gospel alignment.
- Provides oversight for staff development rhythms

such as meetings, retreats, reviews, sabbaticals, and transitions.

- Prioritizes long-term health and development of staff as fellow ministers of the gospel.
- Collaborates with elders and operational leadership to steward compensation, performance, and communication.

Pastoral Presence & Relational Capacity

- Known by and accessible to the congregation. A shepherd by heart with a tender personality toward membership.
- Relates well to people of all ages and backgrounds with empathy, presence, and wisdom.
- Provides pastoral care through a team-based approach, equipping others to shepherd the church body well.
- Invests in the culture of encouragement, joy and vulnerability among staff and leaders.
- Does not prioritize or maintain a prominent online

or social media presence-invests relationally in the embodied church.

- Exhibits maturity in offering and receiving corrective feedback with grace, and skillfully leads others through conflict toward unity and resolution.

Collaboration with Elders, Staff, and Ministry Teams

- Serves as the theological and directional leader of the Elder Board.
- Leads the Lead Team through vision casting, mentoring, performance development, and gospel encouragement.
- Ensures doctrinal consistency, organizational alignment, and cultural integrity across all ministries.
- Builds healthy rhythms of communication, collaboration, and celebration within the leadership team.
- Responsibility of Financial Stewardship/Oversight

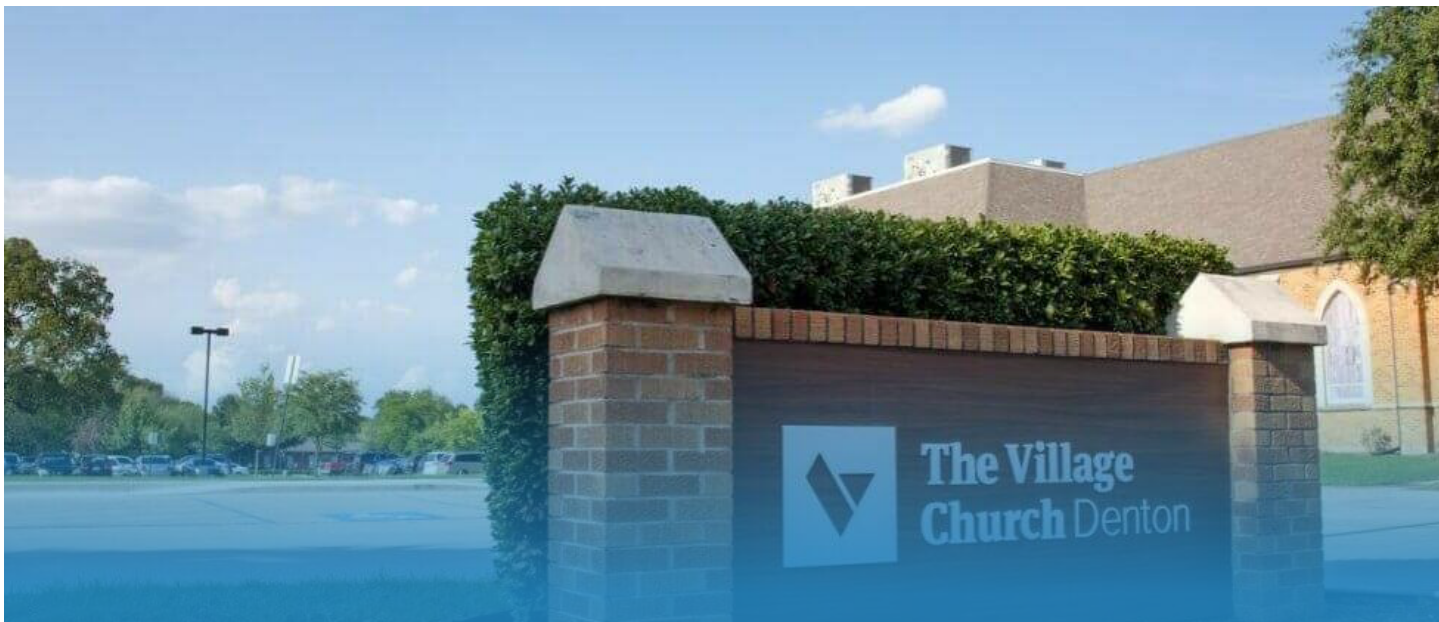

THE LOCATION

Overview

Denton is a vibrant and growing city in North Texas, located about 40 miles north of Dallas and Fort Worth. With a population of just over 150,000, Denton offers the unique feel of a close-knit community while still enjoying the amenities of a major metropolitan area nearby. Known for its blend of small-town charm, artistic culture, and educational opportunities, Denton is both deeply rooted in tradition and open to growth.

Culture & Community

Denton has been described as one of the most creative and welcoming communities in Texas. 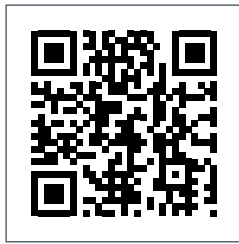
